SOCIAL JUSTICE AND OUTREACH

ABOUT MANNA - Manna Homeless Society and Our Knox Church -Manna is a charitable organization, that cares for the wellbeing of the homeless and the impoverished in Oceanside. Many of the people Manna helps are not Homeless, but rather are struggling to meet monthly expenses after the rent is paid. They may be ill, handicapped, working poor, elderly and have lost a spouse, and many other reasons.

What does Knox do to support Manna? Through our Outreach Committee we make and deliver 50-70 sandwiches 2X monthly to the Parking Lot on Jensen across from the civic Center. We collect clothes, food, tarps, knit items, personal care products etc. in the Manna Box in the hallway near the lounge. We have donated monies to help purchase a new cube van, which is used to deliver clothes, food and other items around the community. We have also donated monies to help run the charitable work that Manna does. We also deliver Thrifty Foods day old bread and bakery products twice monthly to the parking lot on Jensen.
